

## Students

### INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE

The Superintendent or designee may approve interdistrict agreements. Permits for returning interdistrict students will continue for students when:

1. The returning student is in good standing.
2. Legal mandates permit.
3. Notification of Return form is filled out and submitted by May 31<sup>st</sup> each year.

Interdistrict permits may be revoked if:

1. Continuance would lead to program or enrollment overload.
2. Student is excessively tardy or absent from school, or student is brought to school excessively early or left excessively late.
3. Student fails to uphold appropriate behavior standards.
4. Student fails to make appropriate academic efforts.
5. False or misleading information was provided.
6. Reason for the original issuance of the permit by the district of residence is no longer valid.
7. Other conditions that occur that would render continuance inadvisable.

### Special Education Students

Students enrolled in special education programs must apply for a SELPA (Special Education Local Plan Area) permit through their district of residence.

### Expelled Students

The District may revoke a student's enrollment if he/she is recommended for expulsion pursuant to Education Code 48918. (Education Code 48309)

Students expelled in other districts will not be accepted on interdistrict attendance agreements without Board approval.

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE (continued)

Appeals

The parent(s) or guardian(s) must be informed of their right to appeal to the County Board of Education if the District denies a transfer request.

Report to Superintendent of Public Instruction

The Superintendent or designee, if required, is to report annually to the Superintendent of Public Instruction the following:

1. The number of requests for interdistrict transfers.
2. The number of students transferred out of the District.
3. The number of students transferred into the District.
